RESIDENCE REFERENCE: UNKNOWN

Mara Ellaby reports memories of a house she has never visited, a hidden room, and a mother who cannot be identified within the family history available to her.

The account does not present as fantasy or apparition. It arrives through domestic detail: rooms, photographs, letters, repeated names, and the certainty that something familiar has been removed.

SEALED LETTERS

Written traces surviving where names, relationships, and access have been withheld.



Memory returns through objects before institutions agree to name it.

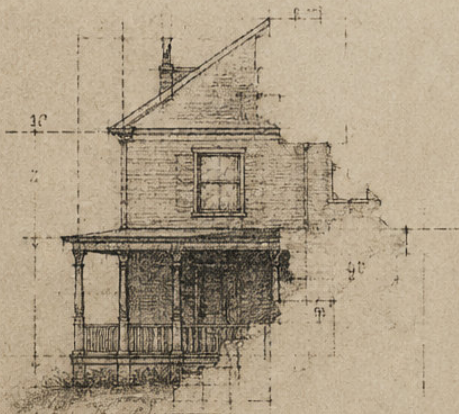

INVESTIGATOR'S NOTE

DR. ELIANOR VALE

Role: Child Psychologist / Investigator

Dr. Elianor Vale begins with a child's impossible memory and follows it into a system made of clinical language, family money, legal caution, altered photographs, sealed rooms, and good intentions.

Blackmere is not supernatural. Its methods are human, procedural, and psychologically real.
